Crisis options when Money Talks Baltimore is open:

If you have a psychiatric crisis during business hours, either you or someone else you chose should call the office at 410-670-5889 and ask for an emergency appointment. During this appointment you will be evaluated, and the best course of treatment will be discussed. The least restrictive option will be chosen that provides you with the support and resources you need.

- One option may be to speak with your prescribing doctor about medication changes. Another option may be psychiatric day treatment which is short term treatment for several hours a day, several days a week under the care of a psychiatrist and a registered nurse.
- Another option may be residential crisis services which is a short term voluntary stay in a 24-hour staffed home to prevent psychiatric hospitalization. It can also be used following psychiatric hospitalization to ease the transition back into the community.
- The last option may be psychiatric hospitalization. If you present yourself as a threat to self or someone else, voluntary hospitalization will be discussed with you which means you agree to going to the hospital. If you refuse to go to the hospital, attempts may be made to have you involuntarily hospitalized – meaning against your will. This is a last resort, but sometimes necessary to prevent injury/and or death.

If you do go into day treatment, residential crisis services, or to the hospital, Money Talks Baltimore will provide all the necessary mental health information to the provider, assist in getting you admitted, notify your emergency contact, participate in discharge planning, and assist in scheduling appointments with your mental health provider(s) i.e. Psychiatrist, within a week of discharge.

Crisis options when Money Talks Baltimore is closed:

- If you are in Baltimore City you may call the hotline at Baltimore Crisis Response, Inc (BCRI) at 410-433-5175 24/7 to speak with a counselor. BCRI also has Mobile Crisis Teams – a small group of mental health professionals who will come to you to conduct an assessment.
- If you are in Baltimore County you may call Affiliated Sante Group at 410-931-2214 24/7. They also have Mobile Crisis Teams who will come to you to conduct an assessment.
- You also have the option to visit your nearest emergency department or call 911
